## 2016 LEGISLATIVE SESSION REPORT CARD Bill Summaries

- + HB 2130 Municipalities; Counties; Energy Use; Reporting (SIGNED Chapter 27)
  - Prohibits local governments from requiring businesses to report their energy consumption.
- + HB 2222 Employment Security; Omnibus (SIGNED Chapter 185)
  Reduces the number of appeals in a contested unemployment insurance case.
- + HB 2240 Workers' Compensation; Modifications (SIGNED Chapter 186)
  Make business friendly changes to workers' compensations statutes.
- + HB 2271 Universities; Commercial Paper (SIGNED Chapter 238)
  Allows state universities to issue commercial paper and obtain lines of credit.
- + HB 2302 Securities; Issuers; Website Operators (SIGNED Chapter 53) Modifies crowd funding statutes.
- + HB 2337 Regulations; Deficiencies; Opportunity to Correct (SIGNED - Chapter 362)
   Allows a regulated business the opportunity to correct under certain circumstances.
- + HB 2447 Business Entities; Database; Postings; Requirements (SIGNED - Chapter 322)
   Requires the Corporation Commission to allow for online filing of documents.
- + HB 2450 Expedited Rulemaking; Outdated Rules (SIGNED Chapter 198)
   Allows state agencies the ability to expedite rulemaking that removes outdated administrative rules.
- + HB 2476 School Property; Sales; Leases; Use (SIGNED Chapter 242)
  Allows proceeds from leased or sold school properties to be used at a district's discretion.
- + HB 2483 Municipal Population Estimates; Use (SIGNED Chapter 258)
  Allows for population recounts after five years.
- + HB 2486 Telecommunications Utilities; Relocation; Reimbursement (SIGNED Chapter 259)

  Requires a municipality to reimburse a utility for relocation costs under specific

Requires a municipality to reimburse a utility for relocation costs under specific circumstances.

- + HB 2502 Medical Licensure Compact (SIGNED Chapter 153)
  Permits state compacts for medical licenses.
- + HB 2503 Psychologist; Licensure Compact (SIGNED Chapter 298)
  Permits state compacts for psychologist licenses.
- + HB 2504 Physical Therapists; Compact (SIGNED Chapter 299)
  Permits state compacts for physical therapist licenses.
- + HB 2533 Charter Aircraft; Tax Exemption (SIGNED Chapter 367)
  Corrects statute exempting charter aircraft from sales taxes.
- + HB 2538 Municipal Bonds; Tax Levy (SIGNED Chapter 334)
  Expands the list of expenses that an annual tax levy for which bond payments may be used.

- + HB 2579 Nonwage Compensation; Minimum Wage (SIGNED Chapter 203) Clarifies that "minimum wage" as the nondiscretionary minimum compensation given to an employee.
- + SB 1118 Office of Tourism; Continuation (SIGNED Chapter 108)
  Continues the Arizona Office of Tourism for six years.
- + SB 1207 Department of Transportation; Continuation (SIGNED Chapter 269)

Continues the Arizona Department of Transportation for eight years.

- + SB 1288 Internal Revenue Code Conformity (SIGNED Chapter 155)
  Conforms state tax code to federal tax statutes.
- + SB 1323 Vexatious Litigants; Workers' Compensation (SIGNED Chapter 26)

Allows an administrative law judge to determine a pro se litigant is a vexatious litigant in workers' compensation cases.

- + SB 1388 Rulemaking Exemption; One-Year Review (SIGNED Chapter 355)
  Sets procedures for reviewing rules adopted pursuant to a one-time rulemaking exemption by the Legislature.
- + SB 1398 Fuel Taxes; Streets & Highways (SIGNED Chapter 163)
  Requires counties to publish use of fuel taxes.
- + SB 1417 Distribution Energy Generating Systems (SIGNED Chapter 56)
  Requires warranty disclosure of energy distribution systems.
- + SB 1501 Commerce Authority; Sunset Continuation; Reforms (SIGNED Chapter 114)
  Continues the Arizona Commerce Authority for two years.
- + SB 1490 Transportation Funding; Task Force (SIGNED Chapter 228) Establishes a transportation funding task force to study revenue sources for infrastructure.
- + SB 1504 Drop Box; Private Property; Consent (SIGNED Chapter 59)
  Requires approval prior to the placement of a drop box on private property.
- + SB 1505 Natural Gas Delivery; Tax Exemption (SIGNED Chapter 357)
  Clarifies that natural gas used for energy generation in the manufacturing process is not subject to sales tax.
- + SB 1525 JTED Restoration & Reforms (SIGNED Chapter 4)
  Restores funding to Arizona's Joint Technological Education Districts.
